name: classification scheme but in fact also a system of subordination

situation political space tribe culture identity incorporation recognition strategy reification of culture in the interest of particular groups and elites clientism (as obscuring the objective class situation of peasants and urban proletarians) the role of chiefs

the limitations of cultural relativism, after a glorious beginning

how do African societies organise the political space in the absence of articulated and conscious class relationship or other categorial divisions that cut across the society, such as on the basis of power, wealth, gender, age: they organise themselves on the basis of ethnicity, which is essentially regionality

(this does not mean that no objective class distinctions do exist in Africa, but that they are constantly blurred and obscured because of individual patronage relations between members of different classes)
